FOOD FRAUD LITIGATION FORUM

Participants:	The <i>Forum's</i> Steering Committee welcomes up to 48 leading Plaintiffs' lawyers and not-for-profit representatives who specialize in consumer-oriented food law and food mislabeling matters. Participants are personally selected based on their experience and specialization in these matters.
Our Format:	The <i>Forum</i> is an annual discussion-based meeting. Participants are personally selected by Members of the Steering Committee. The Committee also formulates the Agenda of topics to be discussed during the interactive Sessions. The Chatham House Rule governs all discussion, allowing a free flow of ideas and insights. This coupled with the absence of traditional presentations and lengthy speeches, enriches the discussion.
Program Atmosphere:	This is an intense day-and-a-half of meetings. The five 80-minute Sessions, moderated by Members of the Steering Committee, are a collaborative opportunity for a deep dive within complex issues. A hollow square, for a maximum of 48 people, provides a level playing field. The receptions and dinners provide an ideal environment for referrals and networking. Therefore, this is not a "holiday" type program and as such, significant others or guests do not participate in the Sessions or attend any of the cocktail receptions or meals.
CLE Accreditation:	Upon request, a certificate of attendance outlining participatory hours may be issued. Hours are subject to jurisdictional approvals and requirements. The process takes approximately 8 weeks after the <i>Forum</i> concludes.
Location & Venue:	The <i>Forum</i> is once again being held at The Windsor Court Hotel in New Orleans, LA. The property is approximately a 30-minute drive from New Orleans International Airport and a 25-minute drive from Lakefront Airport. Participation Fee:	The fee to participate includes two nights of accommodation, all meals and wine with dinner, meeting Sessions, online access to materials, and all taxes & gratuities. The total fee is \$3,875.00 USD. Participants are expected to stay at The Windsor Court during the <i>Forum</i> , as the interplay within the group is an important component. The <i>Forum</i> is limited to 48 participants, places are reserved on a <i>first-come</i> , <i>first-served basis</i> . Your place will be confirmed upon receipt of payment.
